A mandatory preventive quarantine began on March the 23rd and initially would have lasted until April the 13th. It was extended until the 11th of May. People over 70 years old are not allowed to go out until May the 31st. Online classes in schools and universities will continue until that date. There are 35 exceptions for the quarantine. Cities implemented the pico y cédula/pico y género measures, allowing people to go out on certain dates depending on their ID or gender.

## Healthcare system



A survey held by the "Federación y el Colegio Médico Colombiano" showed that in general 87,7% of the professionals working in the front-line lack of N95 masks and only a 10% can access to face shields. That is the same proportion for protective uniforms. Furthermore, health workers must work on health centers by law. Compliance with this call is mandatory. Health personnel have showed disagreement due to the lack of PPE, the lack of job stability or decent contracts.

## Healthcare system



The Peruvian government has announced new measures for hiring foreign medical staff who is resident in Peru due to the shortage of doctors and nurses. Currently, doctors, regardless of their country of origin, are able to work up to 90 days during the pandemic period.
