

Lux is part of a larger work, or series of works, dealing with the manner in



which Americans articulate their economic lives and the manner in which these representations collide with each other. The work occupies a terrain between "documentary" and "fict ion", shifting self-consciously betwee the artifice of one modality and the artifice of the other.

Lux is a found object, a rhetorical artifact from the struggle between New England capital and trade unionism in the unorganized South. Lux is a display of an ideologically-determined rhetoric of capitalist efficiency, of "time as value" and of paternalism. As a video persona Lux stands as a demi-Nixon.
