**The Fulbright-Scotland Summer Institute** is a unique educational partnership between the University of Dundee, University of Strathclyde and the US-UK Fulbright Commission with support from The Scottish Government and a host of civic Scotland partners. Ten students from universities across the United States are selected entirely on merit by competitive application and spend five weeks in Scotland during July and August for an intensive programme of lectures, seminars, cultural and study visits on the theme **Scotland: Identity, Culture and Innovation.** The Institute was launched in 2013. The Fulbright Program is the flagship educational and cultural exchange programme of the US Department of State designed to increase mutual understanding between the people of the United States and those in more than 160 countries.

The University of Dundee is one of the world's top universities and an international centre for research in medicine, life sciences, dentistry and microelectronics, art and design, digital media and space exploration.

Dundee's origins date back to 1881 when University College, Dundee was founded and became an independent university in 1967, following a 70-year relationship with the University of St Andrews. The University has more than doubled in size since 1994 and has an annual turnover of around £200 million. It is home to more than 3,000 staff and 18,000 students who have ranked it first in Scotland and among the best in the UK for student experience.

Dundee alumni include Nobel prizewinning pharmacologist Sir James Black; Lord Robertson of Port Ellen, former Secretary General of NATO; celebrity and fashion photographer Albert Watson and award-winning novelist Kate Atkinson. 
